The upper deck is open and is partially air-conditioned. The tour is available to guests who utilize a collapsible wheelchair, are able to make their own way on and off the coach and have an able-bodied companion to assist them. Guests with mobility concerns are cautioned to evaluate their personal level of ability and stamina. The tour ticket is valid for the entire day. Buses arrive every 30 minutes for the red loop (city tour) with the last bus departing from stop number one at 5 p.m. The blue loop (Yas Island Tour) is available every 60 minutes from stop number 5 (Sheikh Zayed Mosque). The Yas Island loop is two hours in duration. The recorded commentary is available in eight languages, including English, German, Spanish, French, Italian, Chinese, Arabic and Russian. Duration noted is the total time of the full loop, not including any optional time guests may spend at the stops. The mosque is not open to visitors on Friday.

In the ancient fishing village of Taqa, visit a fascinating fort and view traditional houses where the local fishermen dwell. Observe how the buildings are constructed with elegant white stones, which are sourced nearby for their heat-resistant quality. Continue to Khor Rori creek, site of the ruins of the age-old city of Sumhuram, once the capital of Arabia's exotic frankincense trade and now part of the Land of Frankincense UNESCO World Heritage site. Gaze at excavations that reveal evidence of a centuries-old city with trade links to settlements in the Far East and even distant Greece. Enjoy a photo stop at the Prophet Mohammed Bin Ali's tomb, whose architecture and especially its twin domes are fine examples of medieval Islamic architecture, another compelling example of the deep historic heritage found in this nearly untouched corner of the world.

The Grand Mosque is open from Saturday to Thursday from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. On days when the ship arrives later or on Fridays, there will only be an outside visit of the Grand Mosque. Food, drink and smoking are strictly prohibited in the mosque.
