Enjoy a glimpse into the past splendor of the Siamese kingdom by visiting the 14th-century city of Ayutthaya, an acclaimed World Heritage site. Founded in 1350, Ayutthaya remained the kingdom's capital until 1767, when the conquering Burmese destroyed it. As you tour the magnificent excavated ruins, you will behold a collection of towering spires known as prangs and begin to understand the significance of the city, which was once one of the world's largest, most cosmopolitan urban areas. Be sure to notice the city's rigid grid layout and the moats and canals around the principal structures. You will also find the Buddhist temples Wat Chaiwatthanaram and Wat Naphramen within the complex. The royal summer palace of Bang Pa-In lies nearby on an island in the middle of a lake. An excellent example of classic Thai architecture, it is one of the most photographed buildings in the kingdom.

- Explore the excavated ruins of Ayutthaya, which became Siam's capital in the 14th century.
- Recognize Ayutthaya's historic significance through the splendor of its architecture.
- See Buddhist temples within the complex that attest to the builders' technical prowess.
- Admire the royal summer palace near Ayutthaya.
- Dress in conservative, weather-appropriate clothing.
- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes.

This tour consists of extensive walking, at times over uneven ground. It is not considered suitable for wheelchair guests or those with mobility concerns. Revealing attire such as sleeveless shirts or blouses, shorts and slippers are not permitted inside the Bang Pa-In Summer Palace. The drive to and from Ayutthaya is about three hours. The tour duration may vary due to traffic conditions.

Gain insight into life in Bangkok, past and present, by cruising the meandering Chao Phraya River and intersecting canals and then visiting key landmarks. During the cruise, you will see houses on stilts, floating grocery stores and water taxis zipping about. Few experiences offer such a candid look at life on Bangkok's waterways. In time, you will arrive at Wat Arun, the glorious Temple of Dawn, whose main spire soars more than 200 feet into the air. A traditional Thai lunch follows, after which you will explore the Grand Palace, an extraordinary example of an ancient Siamese court. Thailand's kings lived here for more than 150 years, and today it is used primarily for royal ceremonies and state occasions. You will also visit the Emerald Buddha Temple within the palace complex. It holds a 14th-century statue of Buddha that was carved from a single piece of emerald-green jasper.

- Cruise the Chao Phraya River for an authentic look at river life.
- Stop at the revered Temple of Dawn, which is said to represent sacred Mount Meru.
- Marvel at the wonders within the Grand Palace, the royal residence for 150 years.
- See the priceless statue of Buddha within the Emerald Buddha Temple.
- Dress in conservative, weather-appropriate clothing with shoulders and knees covered.
- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes.

The drive to and from Bangkok is about 2¼ hours. The tour involves a moderate amount of walking and pontoons to negotiate. Guests must be able to enter and exit the boats with limited assistance. The tour is not recommended for guests with limited mobility or who utilize a wheelchair. Shoes must be removed when entering temples. Shooting photography and videos is only permitted outside the Grand Palace.

Spend hours in Bangkok, seeing the attractions of most interest to you at your own pace. The Grand Palace complex is an excellent choice, as it contains the Emerald Buddha Temple, one of the most iconic attractions in Bangkok. For a deeper look into the history of Thailand, you might browse the National Museum, which opened in 1874 and has become the country's largest museum. For a glimpse into daily life in Bangkok, you could meander through the warren of narrow alleys and streets in bustling Chinatown or enjoy a serene stroll through Lumpini Park, one of the few urban oases in downtown Bangkok.

LCH-007 SCENES OF OLD BANGKOK

Experience the diversity of Bangkok's vibrant Old Town through must-see attractions such as the ornate temple Wat Suthat. Construction began in the late 18th century during the reign of King Rama I, and it became one of the city's largest temples. Be sure to notice its beautiful roofline, golden Buddha and huge red teak arch, which is all that remains of its giant swing. The statues outside were supposedly ballast from rice boats that arrived from China. During a panoramic drive you will stop for lunch at a local hotel before continuing through Old Town. You will pass the massive Democracy Monument, which is dedicated to the ideals that led to Thailand becoming a democratic monarchy in 1932. This excursion also allows time for shopping for exquisite merchandise such as silk and jewelry.

- Admire the architectural splendor of Wat Suthat, an 18th-century temple.
- See the Democracy Monument that tells the story of the 1932 Siamese Revolution.
- Enjoy free time to shop for Thai silk and jewelry.
- Dress in conservative, weather-appropriate clothing with shoulders and knees covered.
- Wear flat comfortable walking shoes.

The drive to and from Bangkok is about 2 ½ hours. The tour includes about 1½ hours of walking and standing with some steps. This tour is not recommended for guests with limited mobility or guests who utilize a wheelchair. Shoes must be removed to enter the temple.

Discover the charms of the Grand Palace and the Emerald Buddha Temple and see firsthand why they are among the most popular attractions in Bangkok. Considered to be an extraordinary example of an ancient Siamese court, the palace was built in 1782 at the beginning of the Chakri Dynasty. The entire complex sprawls over nearly one square mile in the heart of Bangkok and served as the residence of Thailand's kings for 150 years. Within the palace compound, you will find the Temple of the Emerald Buddha, which holds a 14th-century statue of Buddha that was carved from a single piece of emerald-green jasper. The king of Thailand changes the Buddha's robes each season in an elaborate ritual, during which he also sprinkles water over the monks to bring good fortune. Be sure to notice the murals on the temple walls that depict the life of Buddha and steps to enlightenment.

- Enjoy an in-depth exploration of the Grand Palace and Emerald Buddha Temple within.
- See how Thailand's royal families lived in splendor, starting in 1782.
- View a sacred emerald Buddha that was carved in the 14th century, perhaps even earlier.
- Hear about the ritual in which Thailand's king changes the Buddha's robes seasonally.
- Dress in conservative, weather-appropriate clothing with shoulders and knees covered.

Video and still cameras are allowed in the Royal Palace grounds and in the compound of the Emerald Buddha Temple, but not inside the buildings.

Gain a unique perspective of Bangkok's waterways and see some of the attractions that highlight the charms of the river and canals. This enormous, pagoda-shaped structure overlooking the Gulf of Thailand is made entirely of wood, using ancient methods of building. Not even one nail was used in its construction, which began in 1981 and continues today. Nearly every square inch of the Wooden Pavilion is covered with intricate hand-carved wooden sculptures that supposedly reflect the world's ancient knowledge. It is an amazing and emotionally moving sight, inside and out. While browsing the interior, you can expect to view the cavernous inner chapel, which reveals scenes from Chinese, Hindu and Buddhist traditions. Other highlights include a massive carving of the three-headed elephant god Erawan at the entrance and a towering central atrium.

LCH-GG1 SEA TURTLE CONSERVATION

Zip over to Ko Man Nai island on a speedboat to visit a conservation center that breeds sea turtles for release into the ocean. Keeping the seas and marine life healthy is essential to this rural area, as you will first discover at a fishing community on the Prasare River. The residents use traditional techniques to maintain sustainable levels of fish, otherwise one of their main sources of food would be diminished. Preserving the sea turtle population has been the goal of Ko Man Nai's conservation center since 1979, when Queen Siriket established it. There you will observe how sea turtles are bred, raised and eventually released into the surrounding waters. They include hawksbill, green and olive ridley sea turtles, the smallest of the species. Although olive ridleys are abundant, they are still considered vulnerable because their nesting grounds are so limited. Any disturbance to those areas can have enormous repercussions to the turtle population.

- Enjoy an exhilarating ride to Ko Man Nai island on a speedboat .
- See how endangered sea turtles are bred at a conservation center for release into the ocean .
- Observe residents of an ancient river community practicing sustainable fishing methods .
- Dress in weather-appropriate clothing .

Served as a signature dessert known as Khao Lam, sticky rice is typically mixed with coconut milk, black beans, sugar and salt before being roasted over an open fire in a stout bamboo tube. As you will discover firsthand at the Nong Mon Market, Khao Lam is a delicious treat any time of the day.

With so many aromas enticingly wafting through the air, it will be hard to resist dining. But the floating market offers much more than food. You will also find unusual handicrafts, silverware, handmade bags and silk clothing. The atmosphere couldn't be more inviting.

Discover a truly unique lifestyle and culture during your visit to Ko Samui, the Island of Coconuts. Take a scenic coastal drive past exquisite beaches and lush coconut plantations en route to Ko Samui. Stop at the Big Buddha Temple, or Wat Pha Yai. The Big Buddha Temple features a 36-foot golden statue perched atop a wide staircase decorated with dragons. You will also visit the Plai Laem temple. Surrounded by a lake, this serene modern temple features a towering white statue of Guanyin, a goddess who is believed to be the protector of all beings and a source of unconditional love. Her many arms are thought to represent her ability to reach out and provide help. Equally impressive is a statue of a large white laughing Buddha and the temple itself has many beautiful designs that were created by Jarit Phumdonming, a renowned Thai artist. On either side of the Guanyin statue you will find two halls that are adorned with murals and frescoes that depict Buddhist mythology. After a Thai themed Lunch at a beach resort, you'll visit a local home and coconut plantation to explore how the islanders live and work. During your visit you'll learn how the monkeys found on the island are domesticated and trained to pick ripe coconuts, as centuries-old tradition that certainly comes in handy as Ko Samui produces over three million coconuts per month.

- Mingle with the worshipers and gain an understanding of Buddhism at two temples.

They are also good swimmers and relentless when tracking prey. As you walk the dirt paths, the park ranger will describe the intriguing habits of the Komodo dragons and the island's other animals.

- Hear the blood-curdling details of how these giant lizards relentlessly hunt their prey.

You don't need to be a buff to be blown away by this tour of sights showcasing Darwin's wartime heritage. This tropical city on the Timor Sea played a pivotal role in the battle against the Japanese during World War II, as Northern Territory airfields were used to carry out bombing and anti-intruder sorties. But war always has its cost, and these provocations of the enemy made Darwin a constant target for retaliatory bombings. Some 64 air raids rained down on Darwin over a two-year period, resulting in many lost Australian lives and 12 sunken ships in the harbor. You can see actual film footage of the bombings along with many other wartime artifacts during your visit to East Point Military Museum, out on a scenic spit of land at the harbor entrance. Heading further inland, you'll tour the sprawling aircraft collection at the Australian Aviation Heritage Centre. The showstopper here is a massive B-52 bomber on permanent loan from the U.S., but also on display are a B-25 Mitchell, Mirage and Sabre jet fighters, a US Army Huey Cobra with rocket pods and Gatling gun, a Mark VIII Spitfire replica and the fascinating wreckage of a Japanese Mitsubishi Zero.
