Travel to the Renaissance-influenced pilgrimage city of Loreto to view the house that was supposedly the Virgin Mary's and then enjoy a sampling of local wines paired with snacks. According to tradition, angels miraculously carried the Virgin Mary's house here from Nazareth after a stop in Dalmatia. In the 15th century, a basilica was built on Madonna Square to shelter the Holy House of Loreto. While browsing the basilica, you will see the humble one-room house, which contains a black cedar statue of the Virgin above the altar and features remnants of medieval frescoes. Over the centuries, countless pilgrims have worn two shallow indentations in the surrounding marble floor by kneeling in devotion. During free time, you can further explore Loreto, perhaps by shopping or simply taking in the Renaissance ambiance. Later, at Caffé Bramante, you will sample a selection of locally produced wines that may include Sangiovese or a white wine made with Verdicchio grapes.

- Explore the city of Loreto, where angels supposedly carried the Virgin Mary's house.
- See the Virgin Mary's house in the basilica, a revered pilgrimage site.
- Browse the shops during free time for merchandise such as Lady of Loreto medallions.
- Sample an inspired selection of locally produced wines at a traditional café.

Gioachino Rossini and the town of Pesaro are inextricably intertwined as you will discover at the villa where the composer was born and at a piano concert at the Rossini Theatre. As an introduction to the city's cultural diversity, you will view the Big Sphere outdoor sculpture that has become a symbol of Pesaro and the historical cathedral that lies across the street from Rossini's birthplace. Other architectural highlights include an Art Nouveau villa built for pharmaceutical industrialist Oreste Ruggeri and the 15th-century fortress Rocca Constanza. Built as the Teatro Nuovo, the 19th-century opera house was renamed in honor of the composer and is the venue for the annual Rossini Opera Festival.

AOI-005 CULTURAL OSIMO AND CANTINONE CAVES

Delight in the ancient Roman town of Osimo, admiring the spectacular views from its hilltop location and exploring the caves built beneath the city for defensive purposes. As you meander through the streets of Osimo, you will see architectural treasures that reflect the city's past cultural and economic importance. Renaissance-era palazzi line the main thoroughfares, centuries-old churches are abundant and the town hall displays a collection of Roman statues that were excavated in a nearby forum. The 13th-century Cathedral of San Leopardo may have the quirkiest features. Romanesque-Gothic in design, the church is adorned with a rose window encircled by monsters and a door framed by slithering snakes. You will also explore other areas of Osimo such as the Cantinone Caves, a labyrinth of caverns, tunnels and secret passages that were dug beneath the city about 2,500 years ago. The meanings behind some of the symbols carved into the walls are still a mystery.

- Discover the charms of Osimo, which the Romans called Auximum after conquering it.
- Stroll through serene plazas lined with architectural gems, especially churches.
- Explore secret tunnels and caves that lie beneath the city, if you wish.

Frasassi also has the distinction of containing Europe's single largest cave, the Cave of the Wind. Named for the strong air currents that blow through it, the cave is so massive that it could hold the Cathedral of Milan. Back in Ancona, you will explore historical attractions such as the 12th-century Cathedral of San Ciriaco, the remnants of a Roman amphitheater and the 13th-century Palace of the Senators, which is decorated with reliefs of knights.

Still, the most renowned symbol of the past is the arch that Roman emperor Trajan commissioned near the port. The marble, Corinthian-columned monument has been restored and stands as a reminder of ancient Rome's interest in Ancona.
